

Petition for a private bill: called Act of Settlement (Lord Webb) bill for the further Limitation of the Crown and better securing the Rights and Liberties of the Subject including and better preventing personal injuries of Lord Lancelot Junior Webb

To the Honourable the Commons of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Northern Ireland in Parliament assembled:

The Humble Petition of Lord Lancelot Junior Webb at Cheam Ward, Sutton

SHEWETH:

1. That your Petitioner, Lord Lancelot Junior Webb, is a subject of His Majesty, residing in the United Kingdom, and being a person of lawful age and sound mind, is desirous of seeking the intervention of this Honourable House under the provisions of the Act of Settlement (1700), Chapter 2, 12 and 13 Will 3, enacted for the further limitation of the Crown and the better securing of the rights and liberties of the subject.
2. That your Petitioner is of the Webb family, whose coat of arms is settled in Westminster Abbey, and is a descendant of the Lords of Middlesex and the Kings of Wessex, and is thereby connected to the historical legacy and governance of this realm.

That the Act of Settlement (1700) establishes principles for the governance of succession to the Crown and safeguards for the liberty of His Majesty's subjects, including provisions to prevent undue influence and the encroachment of foreign interests.

That your Petitioner humbly submits that inclusion within the purview of the Act of Settlement (1700) is essential not only for securing and protecting the lawful rights, privileges, and freedoms of your Petitioner, but also for the better prevention of personal injuries and the maintenance of justice and equity.

That circumstances have arisen that necessitate a private bill, titled the "Act of Settlement (Lord Webb)," to ensure the rights and protections guaranteed under the Act are extended to include safeguards for the personal safety, dignity, and well-being of your Petitioner, Lord Lancelot Junior Webb.

That the proposed Act of Settlement (Lord Webb) would seek to:

Further limit the Crown in accordance with constitutional principles;

Secure the personal liberties and protections of Lord Lancelot Junior Webb;

Establish specific measures to prevent personal injuries and uphold the dignity and security of your Petitioner;

Enhance the legal and equitable protections afforded to individuals under the Act of Settlement (1700).

That such a measure aligns with the enduring objectives of the Act, to uphold the Constitution, maintain the integrity of governance, and safeguard the liberties and security of His Majesty's subjects.

YOUR PETITIONER THEREFORE HUMBLY PRAYS:

(a) That this Honourable House will be pleased to consider and pass a private bill titled the "Act of Settlement (Lord Webb)" under the authority and principles of the Act of Settlement (1700), Chapter 2, 12 and 13 Will 3, to provide for the further limitation of the Crown and the better securing of the rights and liberties of the subject, including measures to better prevent personal injuries of your Petitioner;

(b) That such a bill will include provisions ensuring compliance with existing constitutional law and equity, while fostering justice and security; and

(c) That your Petitioner be granted such other and further relief as to this Honourable House may seem just and equitable.

And your Petitioner, as in duty bound, will ever pray.
