

Petition for a Private Bill: To Provide Compensation for Lord Lancelot Junior Webb and his Family under the Law Reform (Personal Injuries) Act 1948

To the Honourable Members of the House of Commons, House of Lords and the King in Council:

The Humble Petition of Lord Lancelot Junior Webb of Cheam Ward, Sutton

Sheweth:

This petition seeks redress for the grievances and injustices suffered by Lord Lancelot Junior Webb and his family, arising from unlawful actions, systemic negligence, and violations of statutory rights. Below are the specific issues and the relief sought:

1. Unlawful Seizure of Funds

Grievance:

The enjoyment of Lord Webb's legal estate and equitable interest was restricted under Sections 1 and 12 of the Law of Property Act 1925, the Prescription Act 1832, and related statutes.

Relief Sought:

Recognition and enforcement of Lord Webb's property rights.

Compensation for loss of enjoyment and financial damages.

5. Negligence by Hammersmith and Fulham Council

Grievance:

From 2018 to 4th October 2021, the Council's negligence and/or breach of statutory duty caused distress, psychological harm, and contributed to the death of Lord Webb's father, Lancelot Clive Webb.

Relief Sought:

Formal acknowledgment of negligence.

Compensation for emotional distress, psychological harm, and loss of life.

Implementation of systemic improvements to prevent future occurrences

Conclusion

In light of the grievances outlined above, this petition respectfully requests the House of Commons, House of Lords and the King in Council to:

Investigate each issue thoroughly.

Provide adequate remedies and compensation to Lord Webb and his family.

Ensure systemic reforms to prevent the recurrence of these injustices.
